### **Education Assistance Fund**

In 2017 the Jeri Cranwell Education Assistance Fund (EAF) gave grants totaling \$5,122.84. The fund was named for Jeri Cranwell, who was the President of the Credit Union from 1963 - 1990. Included in this total is a sub-category of funds; 2 grants of \$500 each from the Ted Foster Memorial Fund, which was dispersed as part of the EAF. We have three wonderful volunteers: Georgia Inloes, Judy Robertson, and Sheree Nale who study the grant applications and come to a consensus on where the funds should be dispersed. Please note: the EAF volunteers only look at the request and amount, they don't focus on what school or district from which the requests are coming. To receive funds the schools must be in a Weld County School District and the application must come from a member of WSCU.

To date Weld Schools Credit Union has given over **\$114,000.00** back to Weld County classrooms!

In 2018 WSCU will continue to support the Jeri Cranwell Education Assistance Fund in order to pay homage to the educators for which our credit union was built. The deadlines for submission of an EAF grant application are February 15 and October 15 of every year. The volunteers will meet by the end of the month and we will have the funds dispersed by the first of the following month. The applications can be found online at weldschoolscu.com

### Checks Ed. Questions you're afraid to ask!

**Q:** Halleluja, I am getting a tax refund this year! What numbers do I put down for my checking or savings account so the IRS can deposit my money faster with no hassle? **A:** The numbers you give to the "tax person" for your refund are <u>very important</u>. If you want the refund in your checking account then look at your personal checks. The first group of numbers on the bottom, left hand side are your Routing and Transit Numbers for WSCU. 307076724 The next

set of numbers in the center is your checking account number. The last set of numbers you need to <u>ignore</u>, as they are the actual number of the check you are looking at! If you want your deposit to go into your regular savings account, then provide WSCU's routing number and your member number.



### **Dormant Account**

Please remember to make at least one transaction on your savings and checking account once a year. A \$5.00 per month Account Inactivity Fee is charged when there is no transaction of any kind posted on a member account for one year. This fee is waived under the following circumstances:

- Member is under the age of 18
- Member has a certificate of deposit
- Member has an active WSCU loan account
- Aggregate of all shares accounts=\$250.00 or greater However, if these accounts are not used in 5 years, WSCU must close the account and send the funds to the Colorado Department of Treasury Unclaimed Property Division ('Colorado Payback' Program).
